

10+ steps to creating simple HTML files: steps 1-6

Objective: *By the end of this lesson you will be able to create your own HTML web document using Notepad and display it in a Browser*

You will need to use the following software

- Your Internet browser
- Notepad (Start / Programs / Accessories)

Instructions

You will now prepare an HTML document to introduce yourself. Your document will have a paragraph about yourself. It will display a picture from the Internet along with a short description of the picture and why you chose it.

1. At step 6, copy everything from <HTML> to </HTML> and paste it in a New Notepad workspace.
2. Save this in an HTML folder in your Home folder on the LAN (your teacher will give you a filename that has your ID, name, class, and what you should call this document). Save your work often while doing this assignment.
3. Change the text between <TITLE> and </TITLE> to a description of your page.
4. Change the text between <P> and </P> to something about yourself.
5. Use and <I> tags to create bold and italic text where you think appropriate.
6. Place a picture on your page and add another <P>aragraph to your page to describe it and say why you chose it.

How to obtain a picture:

1. Use **Google Image Search** to find an image of your choice: <http://images.google.com/>
2. Right click on the image and select its **Properties**. You will see its URL.
3. Place your cursor at the start of the URL and scroll down and right until you have highlighted the entire URL. Use Ctrl-C (or right click / copy) to copy the URL to your computer's memory or pasteboard.
4. In your HTML document, where the code says paste the URL in between the quote marks

Save your work in your Home folder and copy it to your teacher's folder in Work Finished.
